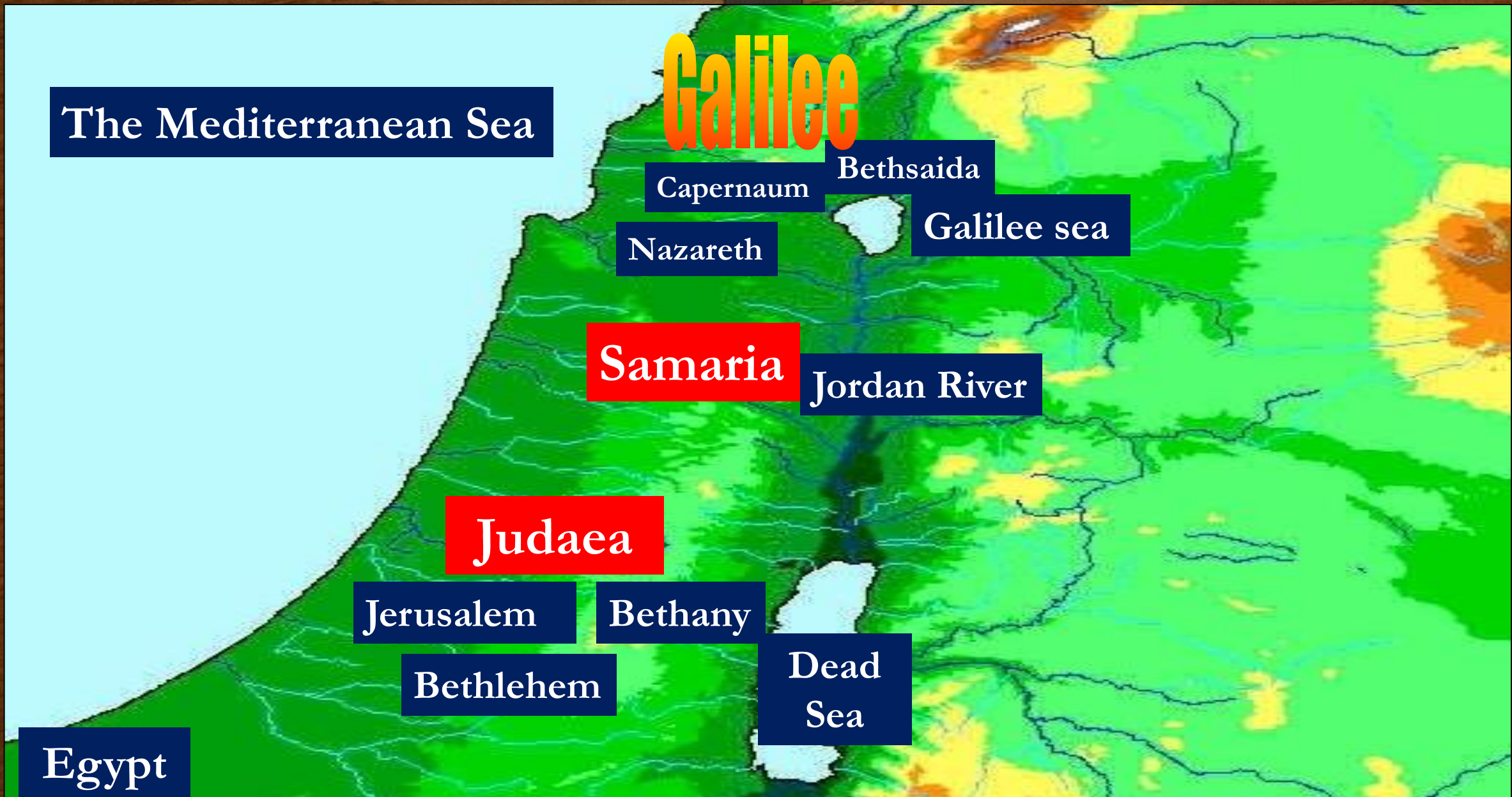

New Testament Overview

- Four Authors of the “Gospel” (*Evangelion*, . “good news”)
 - Matthew, Mark, Luke, John (but Mark is the oldest)
 - One “Acts” of the Apostles
 - Twenty-One “Letters” or “Epistles”
 - “Pauline Letters 14” – attributed to Paul of Tarsus
- + “Catholic/General Epistles” – attribute to other apostles
 - (James; 1 Peter; 2 Peter; 1 John; 2 John; 3 John; Jude)
 - One “Apocalypse” = Book of Revelation (singular!)
 - There are 260 chapters in the New Testament .

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John

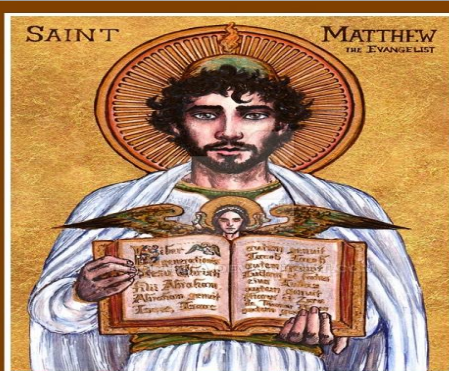
- We have One Gospel was written through four persons.

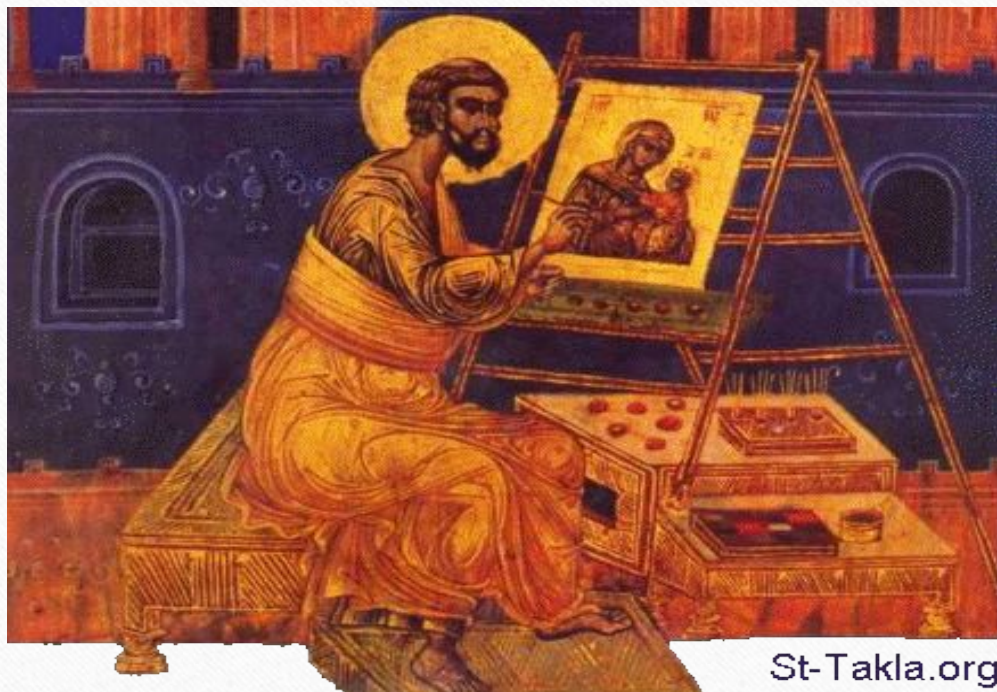
St. Luke

Luke means 'the carrier
of the light' in Latin
Luke 1:1-4 & Acts 1:1-2
Luke 24:50-51 & Acts 1:4

Names:

- the Apostle
- the missionary
- the doctor
- the Virgin
- the martyr

He was an artist who drew an icon of St. Mary



St. Luke was one of the 70 Apostles

The tradition mentioned that he was one of the 70 apostles. (Luke 10)

The tradition also mentioned that he was one of the disciples of Emmaus. So he didn't mention the name. (Synaxarion Paope 22nd)



When and Where

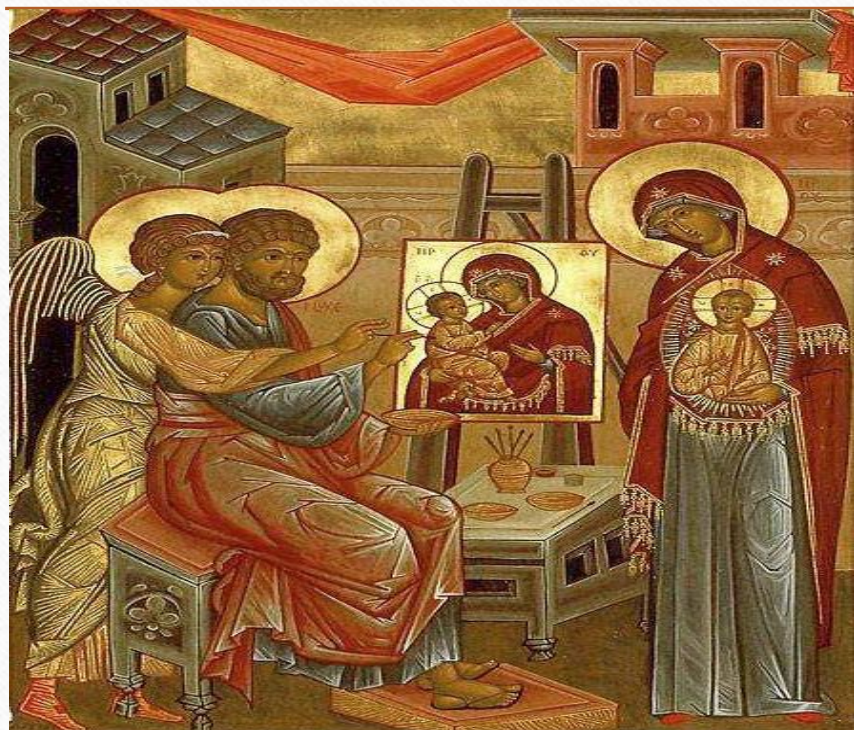
When

- **58-62 AD**
- **Before the destruction of Jerusalem (Luke 21 speaks about that as a prophecy)**

Where

- **In Antioch, during the time St. Paul was in prison**
- **St. Luke was in connection with the disciples and St. Mary at that time (as we can see in the beginning of his book)**

Martyrdom



- He was martyred during the reign of Emperor Neron

The church celebrates his commemoration on Paope 22nd, November 1st

- Emperor Constantinus moved his relics to Constantinople

His Service

- He met St. Paul in his second missionary trip in the city of Terwas and went with him to Philippians
- He met him again and accompanied him in his third missionary trip and went with him to Caesarea and Jerusalem
