Mark / Chapter 11

Short Summaries

The disciples are with Jesus as he enters Jerusalem. He clears the temple and drives out the money-changers.

The 11th chapter of Mark's gospel tells of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his Cleansing of the Temple.

Summaries

In Mark 11, Jesus enters Jerusalem and is welcomed by the people. He then goes to the temple and drives out the money changers. He returns the next day and is questioned by the religious leaders. Jesus teaches about faith and forgiving others. He also curses a fig tree and it withers away.

The book of Mark tells the story of Jesus Christ, from his humble beginnings as a carpenter's son to his tragic death on the cross. Along the way, we witness his miracles, his teaching, and his great love for humanity.
