[1 Kings 16](#) tells the story of King Ahab and Queen Jezebel, who worshiped the god Baal. Ahab built a temple for Baal, and Jezebel had the prophets of the Lord killed.  



King Ahab takes possession of a vineyard that belonged to Naboth, in spite of Naboth's repeated refusals. When Ahab's wife, Jezebel, finds out, she has Naboth killed and Ahab takes over the vineyard.

There was a man named Elah who became king of Israel, but he was evil. One of his commanders, named Zimri, killed Elah and became king in his place. But Zimri only ruled for seven days before he was killed by another commander named Omri. Omri became king and he also was evil.  



[1 Kings 16](#) is the story of King Ahab and his wicked wife, Jezebel. They led the people of Israel into idolatry and were evil in the sight of the Lord. Ahab was killed in battle, and Jezebel was eaten by dogs.



